\$3,775

President Obama promised that health care reform would lower premiums for the typical family by \$2,500. Instead, average premiums in job-based coverage increased by \$3,775. Our plan lower costs by giving you more control and more choices so you can pick the plan that best meets your needs—not Washington's mandates.

On at least 37 separate occasions, President Obama pledged that Americans would be able to keep the plan they like. Instead, millions have lost coverage as insurers were forced to cancel policies that did not satisfy Obamacare's requirements. Our plan delivers more patient-centered health care, not more bureaucracy.

\$1.058T

Obamacare imposes roughly \$1.058 trillion in tax hikes. Our plan repeals all of these punitive tax hikes with responsible reforms that lower costs.

2 MILLION

Obamacare penalizes work in such a way that it will be as if 2 million full-time jobs vanish from our economy by 2025. Our plan protects jobs and implements a flat, simple form of assistance that would grow the economy and ensure that work always pays.

46 CENTS

Our nation's medical liability system is costly, and it hurts the very people it's meant to help. Injured patients receive, on average, only 46 cents of every dollar awarded while the rest goes to their lawyers and administrative fees. Our plan establishes reasonable caps to lower health care costs and make sure injured patients are able to recover full medical costs.

52%

Most small businesses that do not offer health insurance coverage say that the primary reason is cost. While Obamacare did nothing to drive down health care costs, our plan allows small businesses to band together so they can have more leverage to negotiate for lower rates.

\$624B

The status quo of today's Medicaid is unsustainable, with the federal share of outlays set to double over the coming decade to more than \$624 billion. Instead of shackling states with more mandates, our plan empowers states to design Medicaid programs that best suit their needs, which will help reduce costs and improve care for our most vulnerable citizens.

500

There are 10,000 known diseases, 7,000 of which are considered rare, and we only have treatments for 500 of them. Our plan clears out the bureaucracy to accelerate the development and delivery of cutting-edge cures and treatments.

Obamacare's plan was to raid and ration Medicare to the tune of more than \$800 billion. Our plan takes a three-step approach to saving and strengthening Medicare: end Obamacare's raid on the program, improve the program's fiscal health, and put Medicare on a sustainable path.
